St. Croix Festivals

St. Croix hosts its **Carnival Festival** events during Christmas through New Year. Christiansted and Frederiksted share responsibilities of having events. Calypso shows, Latin music venues, food fairs, horse races, parades and more contribute to the spectacular month long event. The adult's parade, often the last big event of Carnival, coincides with Three Kings Day.

Jump Up, A Celebration. Musicians and merchants set up stands and stages where cars would be parked, restaurants and bars flood their food and beverages into the people crammed streets, filling the air with a certain perfume. Stores entice passer-bys with incredible sales and raffles. Mocko Jumbies and onlookers delight in the sounds of the Caribbean while the moon shines above, casting an energizing beam on the happy guests. This could only be one thing, Jump Up. Jump Up started as a way to boost the economy as well as moral on the island, and has become popular among locals and visitors alike. Jump Up is now one of St. Croix's favorite social events. Here, you can taste teasers from many of the restaurants, or hear what local musicians have been creating, slip into the mind of a local artist, win prizes, or find handmade jewelry and crafts to remind you of the Caribbean and its splendor. Enjoy the sounds of the Caribbean with St. Croix's youth playing the Steel Pans. Old cultural stories are told by the Pan and it's Calypso voice or perhaps you may recognize one of your favorite, more modern tunes flowing through the street with a hint of Caribbean seasoning. Every third Friday of each month, families of all ages pack a picnic dinner, gather some blankets, lawn chairs and sometimes even the dog and head out west to Frederiksted to hear the most tantalizing jazz music and watch the setting sun.

Sunset Jazz in Frederiksted is a Frederiksted Economic Development Association (FEDA) event, hosting an impressive roster of local and international jazz musicians on the third Friday of each month. Admission is free and all families are welcome. The music starts at 5:30 p.m. and continues for two hours. Just when the sun will slip into the horizon off the waterfront is up to Mother Nature, but it is part and parcel of the evening inspiration.

ARTS & CULTURE

St. Croix art is a reflection of our beautiful island life. The art mimics the sea and sky, flora and fauna, local culture and people. Local artists capture the Caribbean Sea

and island beauty with paintings, sculpture, pottery, crafts, photography, weaving, and woodworking. Visit the galleries and studios of resident artists located throughout the island for an eclectic combination of styles.

QUADRILLE DANCERS

If you're in luck, the St. Croix Heritage Dancers will be performing a cotillion while you are here. They dance on holidays or at very special events, keeping the art form alive, and teach school kids how to follow callers. St. Croix's traditional "square dance" dates back to the early 1700s, was brought here during the height of its popularity in England, and was adapted as a plantation entertainment. The traditional costume calls for madras plaid shirts for men and skirts, white petticoats, and tied head scarves for women.

STEEL PAN

Quelbe, also known as fungi or scratch, is our official music, dating back to times when African drums were banned, traditionally performed on gourds & combs, ukulele banjos, steel triangles, and homemade music-makers. After cars came along, tailpipes were added, and now a conga drum, electric keyboard, guitar, flute, saxophone and more are included. Other types of music you're likely to hear: calypso, with satirical lyrics, reggae that originated in Jamaica, mellow steel pans that spread from Trinidad after World War II, and cool Latin sounds added to the mix by our large Puerto Rican population.

ST. CROIX CHURCH

Religious tolerance and diversity has been part of St. Croix since Danish times. As early as the 18th century, congregations for most major faiths were established after Moravian missionaries arrived to minister to enslaved Africans. Attend services in one of the historic Moravian, Dutch Reformed, Anglican, Roman Catholic, and Lutheran church buildings still remain.

MASQUERADE

If you are on island for our Crucian Christmas Festival (St. Croix's carnival celebration), be sure to spend a day at the children's or adult's parade, where people dress in towering, elaborate costumes with sequins and feathers and tramp through the town. You'll see floats, walking troupes, and a combination of the two, "floupes." Story telling: Oral traditions go back centuries to Africa and were been passed on through the generations by parents, nannas, and market women who dispensed spells, potions, and charms along with superstitions, proverbs, and spooky tales of ghosts and jumbies. Now and then, you'll find an opportunity to hear these storytellers at events at Whim Museum, Lawaetz Museum, or Mount Victory Camp.

CRAFTSMAN

Crafts: Basket weaving, glass-blowing, caning, mahogany furniture-making are traditional crafts making a come back, and handmade products are sometimes found in specialty shops. Island crafts people turn calabash gourds into bowls or purses, and coconuts into bird feeders you can buy. Look for their work from street

vendors or at country fairs held at the Botanical Gardens, or Whim Plantation Museum.

Arts: St. Croix has dozens of artists, photographers, glass makers and sculptors working in studios around the island. They often incorporate cultural elements like Mocko Jumbies into their work, which is showcased in special exhibitions at Fort Frederik, and the Caribbean Museum Center for the Arts in Frederiksted. You can find private galleries and studios in Christiansted and Frederiksted where original works or prints are offered for sale. From November through June, stroll through Christiansted streets on an Art Thursday gallery walk where you can sip wine and chat with artists about their latest exhibits.

Converted from a sugar plantation into a dairy ranch in the late 1890's by a Danish farmer and occupied by his descendants for the last 100 years, it houses characteristic and unusual antique furnishings and heirlooms, providing a unique view of Danish West Indian life in the early 1900's.

Founded in 1994 with the first annual publication of the "Island Art & Soul" calendar, the Caribbean Museum Center for the Arts has found a home in a 1780, waterfront building in Frederiksted. Mocko Jumbies: Everybody loves the masked stilt walkers in colorful costumes that parade through St. Croix streets during carnival or cavort at Jump Up street fairs. These tall symbols of sacred spirits that protected African villages from evil came here with slaves and are now a cultural art form taught to school kids. You'll often find jumbies dancing at island festivals — when you do, notice that their costumes, with gloves, hats, and masks, reflect their origins—an African Mocko Jumbie never showed any part of the body.

HISTORIC SITES

If you're a history buff, you'll soak up a wealth of atmosphere at every turn on St. Croix, where there is so much to see and learn. When you kayak the Salt River, you can imagine Christopher Columbus approaching the coast of St. Croix more than five centuries ago. Strolling through the Christiansted Historic District, you learn how the Danish bought the island as an agricultural colony and built its towns. At Fort Frederik, you feel chills on the spot where an unexpected proclamation ended slavery forever on these islands. At our museums or on a hike, you can see all that is left of plantation days and learn how sugar changed the course of world history.

It all started on November 14, 1493. To the surprise of Christopher Columbus, aggressive Carib Indians fired arrows his landing party, with fatalities on both sides. Columbus declared that the spot was to be called the "Cape of the Arrows" and named the island Santa Cruz, or Holy Cross, later changed by the French to Saint Croix.

After Columbus, other Europeans came and went, skirmishing over ownership of the land—the English, French, Dutch, Knights of Malta, English, and Danish settlers. The French left but their name for the island stayed. As agriculture developed, European settlers brought thousands of enslaved Africans to work in the sugar cane fields—most of today's residents are descended from them.

In 1733, Denmark bought St. Croix from France to be a plantation colony. Danish surveyors began laying out some 400 estates on the island. Each estate had about 150 acres and was given a colorful name by its new owner—for example, Peter's Rest, Jealousy, All for the Better, Judith's Fancy, or Whim—names we still use for our neighborhoods.

During the 18th century, prosperous St. Croix grew into a major, international center of commerce based on its exports of sugar and cotton and imports from Europe and North America, with more than 200 plantations.

That's when Alexander Hamilton grew from a boy working for a merchant's company to the man who became America's first Secretary of the Treasury.

In 1848, a rebellion by the enslaved African workers forced the Danish Governor-General to proclaim Emancipation. A second uprising in 1878 that destroyed much of Frederiksted, the "Fireburn," initiated by former slaves struggling to survive as contract workers, led to gradual improvements in working conditions.

In 1917, the United States of America bought this slice of the West Indies from Denmark for \$25 million in gold and made it a U.S. Territory. The last crop of sugar was taken off the island in 1966, and today the economy is based on tourism and industry. In all, seven flags have flown over our island named by Christopher Columbus.

CHRISTIANSTED NATIONAL HISTORIC DISTRICT

Christiansted • 340-773-1460 • www.nps.gov
This 7 acre area is mostly on the Christiansted waterfront and was established as a National Historic Site in 1952. The five historical structures exist on the site are the Fort Christiansvaern, the Scale House, Danish Custom House, Steeple Building, and the Danish West Indie & Guniea Company Warehouse. The goal of this site is to preserve the historic structure and illustrate the Danish influence here between 1733 and 1917.

FORT FREDERIK

Frederiksted • 340-772-2021

On the west side of the island lies Fort Frederik, which was built in the 18th century out of necessity by the Danish government to protect St. Croix against invasion of European powers, smugglers and pirates! It gained its status as a National Landmark because of the role it played in two events that eventually led to the dissolution of slavery in the Virgin Islands in 1848. In 1848, Emancipation Revolt ended slavery in the Danish West Indies, but inaugurated a 30-year period of serfdom based on contract labor that ensured continuing control by plantation owners. Then in 1878, escalating tensions erupted into the Labor Riot and Fireburn, which ended the contract labor system.

SALT RIVER BAY NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK

Also known as Columbus Landing, Salt River

Not only is Salt River important historically, it is also a protected ecological preserve. Columbus landed at this spot in America's Paradise in 1493, but encountered the not-so-friendly Carib Indian tribe. This led to the first documented conflict between Europeans and Native Americans. Some believe that Columbus never set foot on land, sending out a search party to explore the new land. Either way - we are proud of this beautiful area, which is recognized as a National Landmark.

ST. CROIX HERITAGE TRAIL

The St. Croix Heritage Trail is a self guided driving tour of the island's historic sites and natural areas. The trail provides linkages between many of St. Croix's major historic attractions such as Whim Plantation Museum, St. Georges Village Botanical Gardens, and Christiansted Historic Site as well as several plantation ruins.

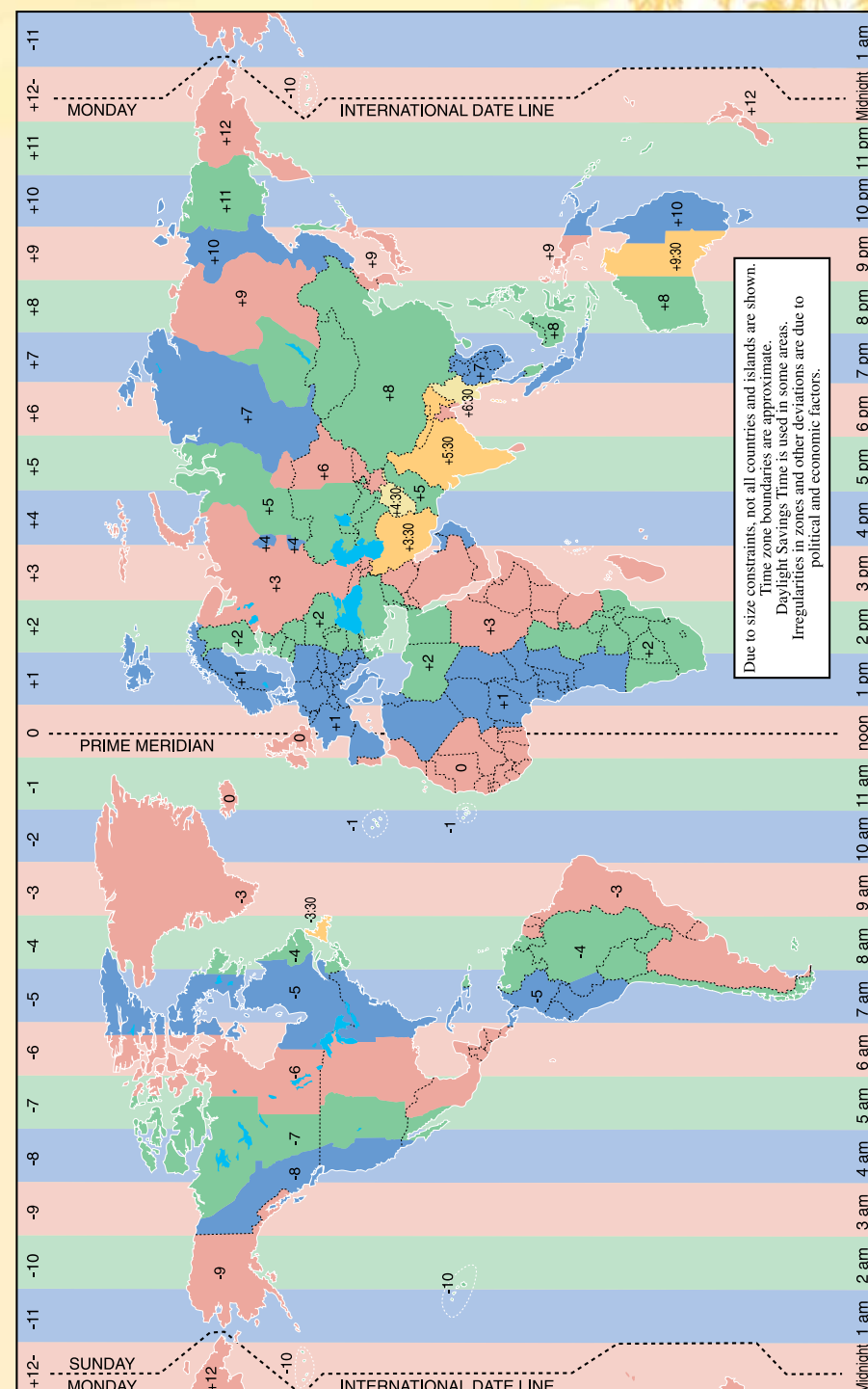

BEACH GUIDE



SOME OF THE BEST BEACHES IN ST. CROIX

CHRISTIANSTED

Protestant Bay

Protestant Cay Beach is great for families with small kids.

The pool-like semi-circle beach is rather warm. And it's perfect for sunning and swimming. Because it takes a little work to get to, it's rarely crowded. Plan to have most of the beach to yourself except on weekends. This is when locals come out and the Cay comes to life. In fact, you may just want to plan a trip out here during the weekend so you can join in the festivities.

EAST OF CHRISTIANSTED

Buccaneer's Beaches

Unless you are a guest of the hotel, you must pay a fee to pass through the guards to get to this beach. A bar and restaurant resides close to the water and is nice to sit and have lunch. There is a short dock to dangle your feet off of. There is a nice rigeline where you can



snorkel. You have a good chance of seeing conch and starfish there - but remember- you cannot remove the animals- please leave them at the beach.

Shoy's Beach

In order to get to Shoy's beach, you have to walk through this narrow path. Once you get through this path, you will be greeted by a long and wide, sandy beach. Privacy is possible and usually on the weekdays, it is definite. From the beach there is a great view of the Christiansted harbor. The water is usually calm with a sandy bottom and shells are abundant.

Tamarind Reef

Past the access road to Green Cay beach, and on your way into the marina, follow the signs to the beach. Tamarind Reef also has a great view of Buck Island and Green Cay. It also offers shade under palm trees or a grass hut. You can rent sea Kayaks and other goodies. There's a bar and restaurant so you can be in the true tropical dream of many...on the beach, under a palm tree, holding a frozen cocktail.

Chenay Bay

Chenay Bay is great for kids. There's plenty of room to run and the water is shallow. It does have a grassy bottom, which makes it the perfect environment for star fish and conch (Please don't try to take them home).

Whether under one of the many trees, or in the casual bar or restaurant, shade is available. Kayaks, sunfish, and snorkel gear are available for hotel guests.

Teague Bay

Duggin's Reef is built right on this beach, which makes eating dinner there very nice. It does make for a great lunch too. On shore, there is seaweed but there are sandy areas to lay in. Also, there's shade under trees and little hermit crabs love to visit. In the water, there are rocks and grassy areas. The water is shallow and snorkeling is great.

Cramers Park

On the weekend this place is more like an amusement park than the beach. There are people everywhere, each having their own stereo, each listening to something different, and LOUD! If you want peace and quiet, then under water is your best bet. It is a great beach,



however. It is shallow close to shore with little effects of strong currents, so it is great for kids. Camping is allowed, snorkeling is great, bathrooms are there, grills and picnic tables provided, and tons of shade.

Isaac's Bay

If after the brief hike to Jack's and a swim to cool you down, you're still up for an adventure, continue hiking around the bend at the end of Jack's for an even better sight. Isaac's Bay has less seaweed and rocks and deeper water. If I had the energy to hike it everyday, I would. Like Jack's it is only accessible by foot and is protected by the Nature Conservatory.

Jack's Bay

Accessible only by foot or boat, this beach is worth the hike or boat ride. I took this picture mid afternoon on a Sunday, notice: if you want privacy, it is all yours! There is a lot of reef around so be careful where you step but snorkeling around is just delightful.

Grapetree Beach

This beach is nice and peaceful. There are houses around, so mind your manners. It offers a long stretch of sand to bask on, decent snorkeling, and it faces south east. There's also a good chance of catching a glimpse of sea turtles at this quiet location.

WEST OF CHRISTIANSTED - NORTH SHORE

Judith's Fancy

Not really a swimming beach but it has lots to offer in the way of coral and shells. Judith's fancy is a spot frequented by surfers. It is shallow and has lots of reef to be thrown against. Snorkeling is good there, but only if the tide is down. Definitely good for riding the waves

Salt River Bay

Columbus' men made the mistake of taking this for an actual fresh water river, needless to say, they were still left very thirsty. Many Kayak tours come in and out of here and on a full moon, it is beautiful. It is protected by the Nature Conservatory and well worth the visit. Lots of birds and fish thrive here as well as Mangroves.

Columbus Landing

As the name states, this is where Columbus and his men landed when on their voyage to the new world. Besides history, it offers great snorkeling, diving, and fishing. It is quiet. There is a grassy bottom with sporadic sandy parts.

Cane Bay

This is home to "the wall," as well as some wrecks and an abundance of sea life. This is one of the greatest diving spots in the world. It is definitely a must see. You can snorkel it as well, but it is so much better on a dive. Cane Bay is a popular place for families to hang out with their kids because it's a one stop beach that has everything.

Davis Bay (Carambola)

Rolling hills, lots of palm trees, and rocky cliffs being sprayed by the ocean mist of crashing waves. If this sounds wonderful, then you've found your beach. It's a resort so you may have to fight for the hammocks and chairs. It has a rocky bottom and often strong currents.

FREDERIKSTED

Sandy Point

One of the best beaches on the island. It is one of the largest stretches of sandy beach in the Caribbean. The water has a drop off and gets very deep very quick. There are some sand bars to stand on and get pelted by the waves, if that gets your attention. Sandy Point has also been the location for commercials and films.

Sand Castle Beach

Sand Castle Beach is the beach directly in front of the Sandcastle on the Beach Resort and Cottages by the Sea. It is a beautiful long stretch of beach with some structure for snorkeling. The calm waters prove perfect for kayaking. You can even see dolphins swimming in the distance.

Public Beach

Public beach is less than a mile left of the Frederiksted Pier. It is a little beach with lots of character with an awesome view of Frederiksted and is great for watching the sunset. The bottom is, for the most part, sandy but if you swim out a ways, the snorkeling is really good. On the weekends it is crowded but does have shade under fruit trees.

Frederiksted Pier

The Frederiksted Pier has been the major attraction on the west end of the island for decades. The base of the pier is surrounded by large boulders, which offer great homes to a variety of marine life. From the base, there is an extension that goes out a quarter-mile. This extension is supported by 3-6 long



pillars that extend to the ocean floor. These pillars are engulfed in soft and hard corals which make this a unique place to snorkel.

Rainbow Beach

The soft white sand and clear water makes Rainbow a perfect spot for snorkeling with young children or non-swimmers. There are a number of interesting fish 2 - 3 feet from shore, some nice shade trees, and very interesting rock formations further along the shore.

Monk's Bath

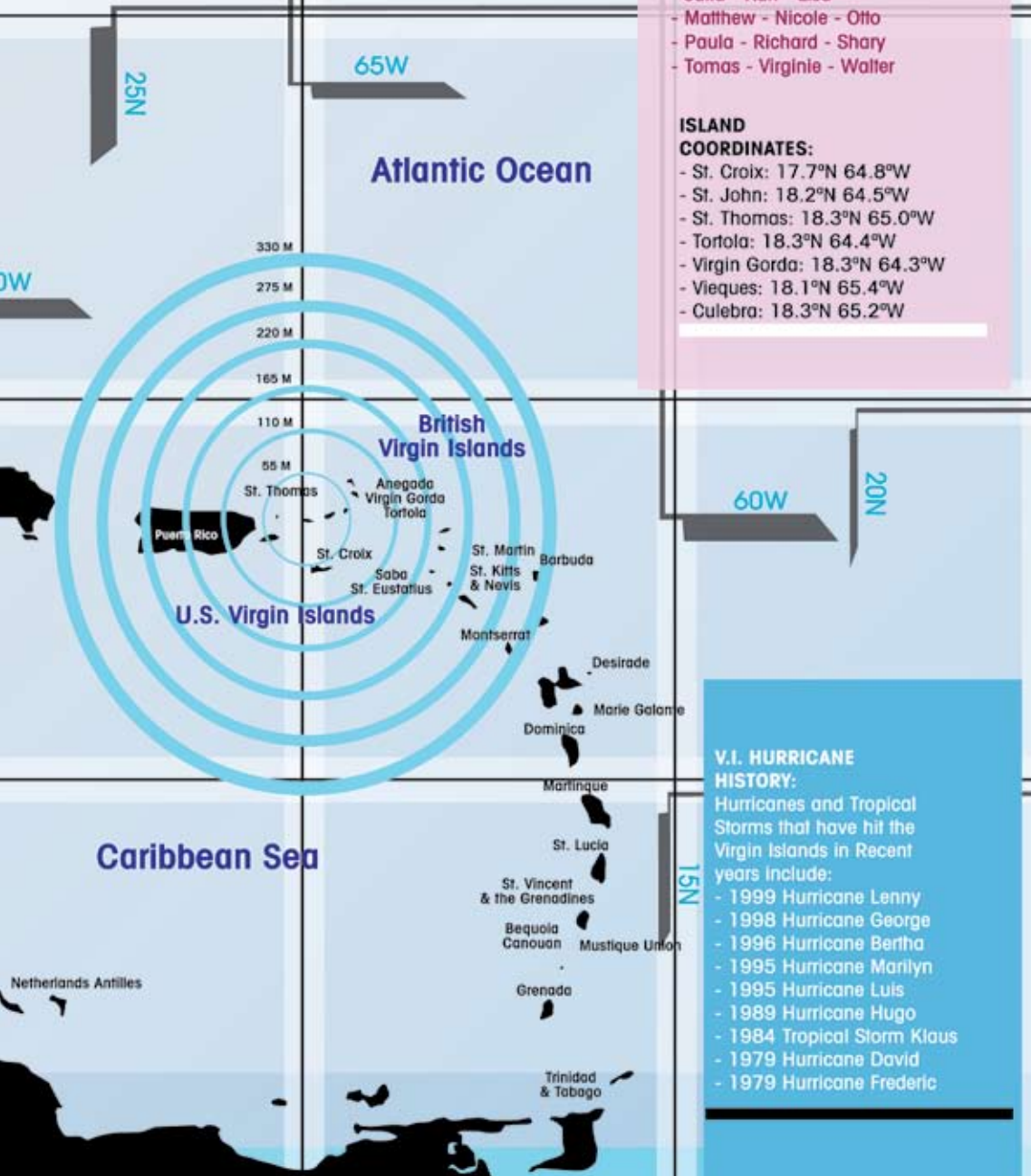
Across from "Northside" and down the steps, the coral formation here have been hollowed out by years of continuous wave action. The snorkeling is excellent.

Sprat Hall Beach

Calm waters make for excellent swimming, and seashells are abundant. Sprat Hall is a fun beach to spend the day at. Lots of sand, calm water for snorkeling, shade for the old folks and a small bar for drinks.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

HURRICANES

Hurricanes are products of the tropical ocean and atmosphere. Powered by heat from the sea, they are steered erratically by the easterly trade winds and the temperate westerly winds, as well as by their own energy. As they move ashore, they bring with them a storm surge of ocean water along the coastline, high winds, tornadoes, torrential rains, and flooding.

Know the Terms

Familiarize yourself with these terms to help identify a hurricane hazard:

Tropical Depression. An organized system of clouds and thunderstorms with a defined surface circulation and maximum sustained winds of 38 MPH (33 knots) or less. Sustained winds are defined as one-minute average wind measured at about 33 ft (10 meters) above the surface.

Tropical Storm. An organized system of strong thunderstorms with a defined surface circulation and maximum sustained winds of 39–73 MPH (34–63 knots).

Hurricane. An intense tropical weather system of strong thunderstorms with a well-defined surface circulation and maximum sustained winds of 74 MPH (64 knots) or higher.

Storm Surge. A dome of water pushed onshore by hurricane and tropical storm winds. Storm surges can reach 25 feet high and be 50–1000 miles wide.

Storm Tide. A combination of storm surge and the normal tide (i.e., a 15-foot storm surge combined with a 2-foot normal high tide over the mean sea level created a 17-foot storm tide).

Hurricane/Tropical Storm Watch. Hurricane/tropical storm conditions are possible in the specified area, usually within 36 hours. Tune in to NOAA Weather Radio, commercial radio, or television for information.

Hurricane/Tropical Storm Warning. Hurricane/tropical storm conditions are expected in the specified area, usually within 24 hours.

Short Term Watches and Warnings. These warnings provide detailed information about specific hurricane threats, such as flash floods and tornadoes.

Before a Hurricane

1. Make plans to secure your property. Permanent storm shutters offer the best protection for windows. A second option is to board up windows with 5/8" marine plywood, cut to fit and ready to install. Tape does not prevent windows from breaking.
2. Install straps or additional clips to securely fasten your roof to the frame structure. This will reduce roof damage.
3. Be sure trees and shrubs around your home are well trimmed.
4. Clear loose and clogged rain gutters and downspouts.
5. Determine how and where to secure your boat.
6. Consider building a safe room.

During a Hurricane

1. Listen to the radio or TV for information.
 2. Secure your home, close storm shutters, and secure outdoor objects or bring them indoors.
 3. Turn off utilities if instructed to do so. Otherwise, turn the refrigerator thermostat to its coldest setting and keep its doors closed.
 4. Turn off propane tanks. Avoid using the phone, except for serious emergencies.
 5. Moor your boat if time permits.
 6. Ensure a supply of water for sanitary purposes such as cleaning and flushing toilets. Fill the bathtub and other large containers with water.
- You should evacuate under the following conditions:*
1. If you are directed by local authorities to do so. Be sure to follow their instructions.
 2. If you live in a mobile home or temporary structure—such shelters are particularly hazardous during hurricanes no matter how well fastened to the ground.
 3. If you live in a high-rise building—hurricane winds are stronger at higher elevations.
 4. If you live on the coast, on a floodplain, near a river, or on an inland waterway.
 5. If you feel you are in danger.

If you are unable to evacuate, go to your safe room. If you do not have one, follow these guidelines:

1. Stay indoors during the hurricane and away from windows and glass doors.
2. Close all interior doors—secure and brace external doors.
3. Keep curtains and blinds closed. Do not be fooled if there is a lull; it could be the eye of the storm - winds will pick up again.
4. Take refuge in a small interior room, closet, or hallway on the lowest level.
5. Lie on the floor under a table or another sturdy object.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

EARTHQUAKES

Earthquakes strike suddenly, violently, and without warning at any time of the day or night. If an earthquake occurs in a populated area, it may cause many deaths and injuries and extensive property damage.

Although there are no guarantees of safety during an earthquake, identifying potential hazards ahead of time and advance planning can save lives and significantly reduce injuries and property damage.

What to Do Before an Earthquake

Earthquakes strike suddenly, violently and without warning. Identifying potential hazards ahead of time and advance planning can reduce the dangers of serious injury or loss of life from an earthquake. Repairing deep plaster cracks in ceilings and foundations, anchoring overhead lighting fixtures to the ceiling, and following local seismic building standards, will help reduce the impact of earthquakes.

Ways to Plan Ahead

Check for Hazards in the Home

1. Fasten shelves securely to walls.
2. Place large or heavy objects on lower shelves.
3. Store breakable items such as bottled foods, glass, and china in low, closed cabinets with latches.
4. Hang heavy items such as pictures and mirrors away from beds, couches, and anywhere people sit.
5. Brace overhead light fixtures.
6. Repair defective electrical wiring and leaky gas connections. These are potential fire risks.
7. Secure a water heater by strapping it to the wall studs and bolting it to the floor.
8. Repair any deep cracks in ceilings or foundations.

Identify Safe Places Indoors and Outdoors

1. Under sturdy furniture such as a heavy desk or table.
2. Against an inside wall.
3. Away from where glass could shatter around windows, mirrors, pictures, or other heavy furniture could fall over.
4. In the open, away from buildings, trees, telephone and electrical lines, overpasses, or elevated expressways.

Educate Yourself and Family Members

1. Contact your local emergency management office or American Red Cross chapter for more information on earthquakes. Also read the "How-To Series" for information on how to protect your property from earthquakes.
2. Teach children how and when to call 9-1-1, police, or fire department and which radio station to tune to for emergency information.
3. Teach all family members how and when to turn off gas, electricity, and water.

Have Disaster Supplies on Hand

Flashlight and extra batteries.
Portable battery-operated radio and extra batteries.
First aid kit and manual. Emergency food and water.
Nonelectric can opener. Essential medicines. Cash and credit cards.

Develop an Emergency Communication Plan

1. In case family members are separated from one another during an earthquake (a real possibility during the day when adults are at work and children are at school), develop a plan for reuniting after the disaster.
2. Ask an out-of-state relative or friend to serve as the "family contact." After a disaster, it's often easier to call long distance. Make sure everyone in the family knows the name, address, and phone number of the contact person.

What to Do During an Earthquake

Stay as safe as possible during an earthquake. Be aware that some earthquakes are actually foreshocks and a larger earthquake might occur. Minimize your movements to a few steps to a nearby safe place and stay indoors until the shaking has stopped and you are sure exiting is safe.

If indoors

1. DROP to the ground; take COVER by getting under a sturdy table or other piece of furniture; and HOLD ON until the shaking stops. If there isn't a table or desk near you, cover your face and head with your arms and crouch in an inside corner of the building.
2. Stay away from glass, windows, outside doors and walls, and anything that could fall, such as lighting fixtures or furniture.

Stay in bed if you are there when the earthquake strikes. Hold on and protect your head with a pillow, unless you are under a heavy light fixture that could fall. In that case, move to the nearest safe place.

3. Use a doorway for shelter only if it is in close proximity to you and if you know it is a strongly supported, loadbearing doorway.
4. Stay inside until shaking stops and it is safe to go outside. Research has shown that most injuries occur when people inside buildings attempt to move to a different location inside the building or try to leave.
5. Be aware that the electricity may go out or the sprinkler systems or fire alarms may turn on.
6. DO NOT use the elevators.

If outdoors

1. Stay there.
2. Move away from buildings, streetlights, and utility wires.
3. Once in the open, stay there until the shaking stops. The greatest danger exists directly outside buildings, at exits, and alongside exterior walls.

If in a moving vehicle

1. Stop as quickly as safety permits and stay in the vehicle. Avoid stopping near or under buildings, trees, overpasses, and utility wires.
2. Proceed cautiously once the earthquake has stopped. Avoid roads, bridges, or ramps that might have been damaged by the earthquake.

If trapped under debris

1. Do not light a match.
2. Do not move about or kick up dust.

What to Do After a Tsunami

The following are guidelines for the period following a tsunami:

1. Stay away from flooded and damaged areas until officials say it is safe to return.
2. Stay away from debris in the water; it may pose a safety hazard to boats and people.
3. Save yourself - not your possessions

Know Your Evacuation Routes

Develop a family hurricane preparedness plan before an actual storm threatens your area. If your family hurricane preparedness plan includes evacuation to a safer location, then it is important to consider the following points:

1. If ordered to evacuate, do not wait or delay your departure. Prepare, to leave when a watch is issued. Be ready to leave when a warning is issued. DO NOT Wait, it could mean life or death.
2. If possible, leave before local officials issue an evacuation order for your area. Even a slight delay in starting your evacuation will result in significantly longer travel times as traffic congestion worsens.
3. Select an evacuation destination that is nearest to your home, preferably in the same county, or at least minimize the distance over which you must travel in order to reach your intended shelter location.
4. In choosing your destination, keep in mind that the hotels and other sheltering options in most inland metropolitan areas are likely to be filled very quickly in a large, multi-county hurricane evacuation event.
5. If you decide to evacuate to another location, be prepared to wait in traffic.
6. Make sure that you fill up your car with gas, before you leave.

3. Cover your mouth with a handkerchief or clothing.
4. Tap on a pipe or wall so rescuers can locate you. Use a whistle if one is available. Shout only as a last resort. Shouting can cause you to inhale dangerous amounts of dust.

What to Do After an Earthquake

1. Expect aftershocks. These secondary shockwaves are usually less violent than the main quake but can be strong enough to do additional damage to weakened structures and can occur in the first hours, days, weeks, or even months after the quake.
2. Listen to a battery-operated radio or television. Listen for the latest emergency information. Use the telephone only for emergency calls.
3. Stay away from damaged areas. Stay away unless your assistance has been specifically requested by police, fire, or relief organizations. Return home only when authorities say it is safe.

Be aware of possible tsunamis if you live in coastal areas.

Tsunami

Tsunamis (pronounced soo-ná-mees), also known as seismic sea waves (mistakenly called "tidal waves"), are a series of enormous waves created by an underwater disturbance such as an earthquake, landslide, volcanic eruption, or meteorite. A tsunami can move hundreds of miles per hour in the open ocean and smash into land with waves as high as 100 feet or more.

Know Your Tsunami Terms

Advisory. An earthquake has occurred in the Pacific basin, which might generate a tsunami.

Warning. A tsunami was, or may have been generated, which could cause damage; therefore, people in the warned area are strongly advised to evacuate.

Watch. A tsunami was or may have been generated, but is at least two hours travel time to the area in Watch status.

What to do Before and During a Tsunami

The following are guidelines for what you should do if a tsunami is likely in your area:

1. Turn on your radio to learn if there is a tsunami warning if an earthquake occurs and you are in a coastal area.
2. Move inland to higher ground immediately and stay there.
3. Stay away from the beach. Never go down to the beach to watch a tsunami come in. If you can see the wave you are too close to escape it.

CAUTION - If there is noticeable recession in water away from the shoreline this is nature's tsunami warning and it should be heeded. You should move away immediately.

Preparing Makes Sense.

The likelihood that you and your family will survive a house fire depends as much on having a working smoke detector and an exit strategy, as on a well-trained fire department. The same is true for surviving a terrorist attack or other emergency. We must have the tools and plans in place to make it on our own, at least for a period of time, no matter where we are when disaster

1 Get a Kit of Emergency Supplies.

Be prepared to improvise and use what you have on hand to make it on your own for at least three days, or longer. While there are many things that might make you more comfortable, think first about fresh water, food and clean air.

Consider putting together two kits. In one, put everything needed to stay where you are and make it on your own. The other should be a lightweight, smaller version you can take with you if you have to get away.

You'll need a gallon of **water** per person per day. Include in the kits canned and dried **foods** that are easy to store and prepare. If you live in a cold weather climate, include **warm clothes** and a sleeping bag for each member of the family. Start now by gathering basic emergency supplies and setting them aside: a flashlight, a battery-powered radio, extra batteries, a firstaid kit, toilet articles and other special things your family may need.

Many potential terrorist attacks could send tiny microscopic "junk" into the air. Many of these materials can only hurt you if they get into your body, so think about creating a barrier between yourself and any contamination. It's smart to have something for each member of the family that covers **their mouth and nose**. Plan to use two to three layers of a cotton t-shirt, handkerchief or towel. Or, consider **filter masks**, readily available in hardware stores, which are rated based on how small a particle they filter. It is very important that the mask or other material fit your face snugly so that most of the air you breathe comes through the mask, not around it. Do whatever you can to make the best fit possible for children.

Also, include **duct tape and heavyweight garbage bags or plastic sheeting** that can be used to seal windows and doors if you need to create a barrier between yourself and any potential contamination outside.

2 Make a Plan

For What You Will Do in an Emergency.

Plan in advance what you will do in an emergency. Be prepared to assess the situation. Use common sense and whatever you have on hand to take care of yourself and your loved ones. Depending on your circumstances and the nature of the attack, the first important decision is whether you stay put or get away. You should understand and plan for both possibilities.

Develop a Family Communications Plan: Your family may not be together when disaster strikes, so plan how you will contact one another and review what you will do in different situations. **Consider a plan where each family member calls, or e-mails, the same friend or relative in the event of an emergency.** It may be easier to make a long distance phone call than to call across town, so an **out-of-state contact** may be in a better position to communicate among separated family members. You may have trouble getting through, or the phone system may be down altogether, but be patient.

Create a Plan to "Shelter-in-Place": There are circumstances when staying put and creating a barrier between yourself and potentially contaminated air outside, a process known as "shelter-in-place," can be a matter of survival. Choose an interior room or one with as few windows and doors as possible. Consider precutting plastic sheeting to seal windows, doors and air vents. Each piece should be several inches larger than the space you want to cover so that you can duct tape it flat against the wall. Label each piece with the location of where it fits.

If you see large amounts of debris in the air, or if local authorities say the air is badly contaminated, you may want to "shelter-in-place." Quickly bring your family and pets inside, lock doors, and close windows, air vents and replace dampers. Immediately turn off air conditioning, forced air heating systems, exhaust fans and clothes dryers. Take your emergency supplies and go into the room you have designated. Seal all windows, doors and vents. **Watch TV, listen to radio or check the Internet for instructions.**

Create a Plan to Get Away: Plan in advance how you will assemble your family and anticipate where you will go. **Choose several destinations in different directions** so you have options in an emergency. If you have a car, keep a half tank of gas in it at all times. Become familiar with alternate routes as well as other means of transportation out of your area. If you do not have a car, plan how you will leave if you have to. Take your emergency supply kit and lock the door behind you. If you believe the air may be contaminated, drive with your windows and vents closed and keep the air conditioning and heater turned off. Listen to the radio for instructions.

Plans at School and Work: Think about the places where your family spends time: school, work and other places your family frequents. Talk to your children's schools and your employer about emergency plans. Find out how they will communicate with families during an emergency. If you are an employer, be sure you have an emergency preparedness plan. Review and practice it with your employees. A community working together during an emergency also makes sense. Talk to your neighbors about how you can work together.

3 Be Informed About What Might Happen.

Some of the things you can do to prepare for the unexpected, such as assembling a supply kit and developing a family communications plan, are the same for both a natural or manmade emergency. However there are important differences among potential terrorist threats, such as biological, chemical, explosive, nuclear and radiological, that will impact the decisions you make and the actions you take.

4 Remain Calm

Be prepared to adapt this information to your personal circumstances and make every effort to follow instructions received from authorities on the scene. Above all, stay calm, be patient and think before you act. With these simple preparations, you can be ready for the unexpected.
